Messages of Love

February is traditionally associated with love due to Valentine's Day. National Random Acts of Kindness Day is also in February, "a day to spread love and positivity and to show the world that even small acts of kindness can make a big difference" The messages brought by our guest speakers at Meeting for Worship in February aligned perfectly with this theme.

On Feb. 12, John Muhanji, FUM's Africa Ministries Director, brought the message on Zoom all the way from Kenya. He focused on three directives: following Christ, making disciples, and loving one another.

He began with the Biblical mission that demands "those who claim Christ's name should be like Him by taking up their cross, denying themselves, and following Him in the paths of humility, love, integrity, generosity, and servanthood."

From Matthew 28, he urged us to respond "to the call of Jesus: 'Therefore go and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you."

Most importantly, he reminded Friends to love one another and "Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace." He said that "a divided church has



no message for the divided world. Our failure to live in reconciled unity is a significant obstacle to authenticity and effectiveness in our mission."

This powerful message, however, was unfortunately and ironically interrupted by a power outage in Uptown Whittier. The Zoom link prevailed, though, and those joining online were able to stay connected until the end of the program. Friends in the Meeting House simply had a little extra time to center and experience open worship.


Patriot competitor on Troy High School's Cyber Defense cyber security team. Through a series of online competition

Loletta's Lines

Simply put, a Sabbatical is a rest from work, based on a Biblical, agricultural practice. In Leviticus 25, God's people were commanded to take a year-long break from working the fields



every seven years. This was to allow time for both the land and the people to rest and be replenished. Today it is common for academics and clergy to be released from teaching, administrative, and care duties for a paid time of rest and study.

I am very grateful the 2014 call agreement between the Meeting and myself included a sabbatical leave of three months after a period of five years. In 2020, the pandemic scuttled any sabbatical plans. So this spring, in our eighth year together, I will take a sabbatical from April 18 to June 16.

The Meeting is releasing me to rest, study, and travel. The Pastoral Care and Support Committee has been preparing a plan for pastoral care and ministry while I am away. They also anticipate my opportunities for study and reflection to engage, stretch, and empower Friends and the Meeting for the future.

At Monthly Meeting in November, I asked, "Where would you all go if you had three months for a sabbatical?" I heard many fun and interesting ideas. Three themes resonated: rest, an opportunity to engage spiritually with other Quakers, and a fun adventure. I researched sabbatical best practices, listened to the Spirit, and identified three goals.

Music for Holy Week Music Sunday - April 2, 2023

The musicians of First Friends will present a Music Sunday, April 2nd, based on the Passion Gospel according to



Matthew. We will read the account of Jesus's journey to the cross and will intersperse musical meditations at key points of the story. I feel it is significant for our community to hear the scripture, telling of the events between Palm Sunday and Easter, in order to fully experience Jesus' experience and the joy of his resurrection.

Some of the music will be sung by our singers, and a couple of hymns will allow all to participate. Presenting Passion Gospels has a centuries long precedent, with its height in the music of J.S. Bach and his famous *Matthew* and *John* passions. Bach was an innovator as he included devotional musical commentary at various points to encourage meditation by the congregation. We will follow a similar pattern, though our music will be much simpler and will fit the musical resources we have.

Organ and Hymns of Holy Week - April 6, 2023, 7 pm

On Maundy Thursday, April 6th, I will present a selection of organ pieces and some hymns to sing for Holy Week, the week leading up to Easter. This will be much like our Twelfth Night evening of Christmas music. Organ pieces by J.S. Bach, Johannes Brahms, Helmut Walcha, Paul Fey, and others will be included. Hymns will include: All Glory; Laud and Honor; Ubi caritas; Go to Dark Gethsemane; In the Cross of Christ I Glory; Ah, Holy Jesus; and When I Survey the Wondrous Cross. Please come to the Meeting House and bring F(f)rlends to lend your voice to the singing on April 6.

On February 19th, Bobby Trice, FCNL's Quaker Engagement Program Manager, brought the message, *Doing Justice More Justly*. In it he reminded Friends of the importance of practicing authentic integrity when working for social justice and equity. He says, "I am more convinced than ever that building Beloved Community where our differences are affirmed rather than eradicated is <u>both</u> an essential piece of the world FCNL seeks to bring about <u>and</u> a pathway to it.

He reminded us to "love tenderly so we may live in the kindom of God," and critically reflect on our approach to advocacy. He urged us to catch and change our own social conditioning in order to illuminate biased assumptions and deep patterns of racial power dynamics that can actually hurt those we are trying to help. He says, "If, while advocating, we enact the very dynamics of harm and oppression we are trying to change in policy, we are out of alignment with integrity AND limit our ability to build relationships and leverage power to change systems."

First Friends Church is grateful for the technology that allows us to connect with Quakers across the globe and hear these messages.

Whittier Advocacy Team Focus on Peace Building



An exciting and unfolding development out of our November FCNL West hospitality hub is an Advocacy Team. Our team has formed with Friends from

our meeting and friends of Friends in our community. We are learning, planning, and working to advocate with our Senators and Representatives in Washington, DC and with the media concerning funds for peace building.
